His former students and colleagues commend his ability to balance tradition with visionary leadership, ensuring that agricultural education remains relevant impactful. Indiana FFA - Unified Horticulture CDE

Indiana FFA launched its first-ever Unified Horticulture Career Development Event (CDE) in April 2024, providing FFA members with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to compete in an inclusive, skill-building environment. This innovative contest, developed in Fall 2023, focuses on identifying plants, evaluating produce quality, and applying workplace problem-solving skills. Participants compete with the support of peer FFA members, fostering engagement and a sense of belonging. The inaugural event saw 15 competitors successfully complete the contest, with top individuals recognized on stage at the state convention. Indiana FFA continues to expand its commitment to inclusion, with plans for additional Unified CDEs in the future.

WASHINGTON AG INNOVATIONS CDE



The purpose of the Agriculture Innovations CDE is to connect ag education student's skills that relates to ag technology education. This CDE focus' on skills that develop innovative solutions to enhance productivity, sustainability, and efficiency in farming. Students can work on projects involving precision agriculture, data analysis, remote sensing, or agricultural automation.



INDIANA AG EQUIPMENT DIAGNOSTICS CDE

The ag equipment diagnostics event is designed to teach high school youth skills to become a technician working in the ag equipment industry. Participants learned about electrical systems in 2024 and were given a scenario that used their knowledge, skills and equipment to diagnose the problem and write a work order, same as if they were working at an equipment dealer.

ARIZONA MASTERS OF BEEF ADVOCACY

The purpose of the Masters of Beef Advocacy CDE is to provide individuals with knowledge and understanding of beef and the beef lifecycle and the tools to share that information. The contest allows students to complete the MBA program and then showcase their knowledge and ability to share facts and information about the beef community with those who have questions or concerns.
